



There will also be changes in the formation process. Elizabeth introduced Dana Gutierraz who will serve as ABWA's new Chapter Development Manager.


ABWA's Fall Membership Campaign: Sept. 1st to Nov. 30th "Turning a New Leaf". This is reflective of new leadership and pending changes.

#### **Just in Time Webinar information**

#### from Executive Director Elizabeth Johnson

Just in Time webinar recording - If you were unable to join us 9/25, the recording of the webinar is now available on the National Resources page under "Achieve / Just in Time". It is accessible via YouTube, though you need the link to access it.

Certificate - Certificates are no longer generated for participation in the JIT webinars. Instead, your participation is automatically logged in your membership platform. You can see this under "Member Profile" and "Professional Development".

Accessibility to the Just in Time webinar - If you had difficulty logging in for the webinar, here are a few tips from Zoom.

1. Be sure to use your ABWA membership platform email to access Zoom. Zoom and Your-Membership are linked. In order to keep the meetings members only, it has to authenticate that you are in fact a member of ABWA. It does so by using your ABWA membership login email. (If you use a work Zoom or have a separate account other than your ABWA email attached to Zoom, you'll want to make sure you are not logged in under that account).

- 2. Make sure your ABWA membership is up to date. If your membership is expired, you will be unable to access the webinar (see #1 above).
- 3. A new link is set out for every webinar via Zoom. Be sure to keep that link, or better yet, add it as a calendar invite. If you are unable to find that email/link, contact the ABWA office and they will resend you the link for you. Your link is tied to your account so it will reflect in your records as having attended. The earlier you can request this link, the better, as our staff is working hard during the webinar itself.

Thank you for bearing with us while we adapt to the new YM/Zoom platform. This is our second webinar on the platform and while change can be difficult, the long-term pay off for the membership is there. By integrating the webinars with Zoom, we can easily confirm membership, and log your participation without the need for certificates.
