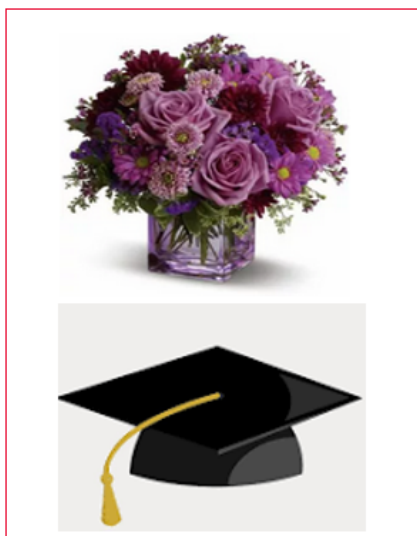

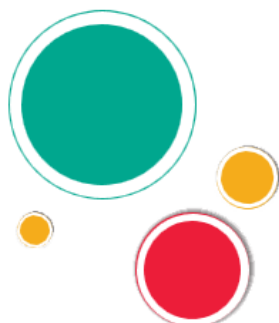

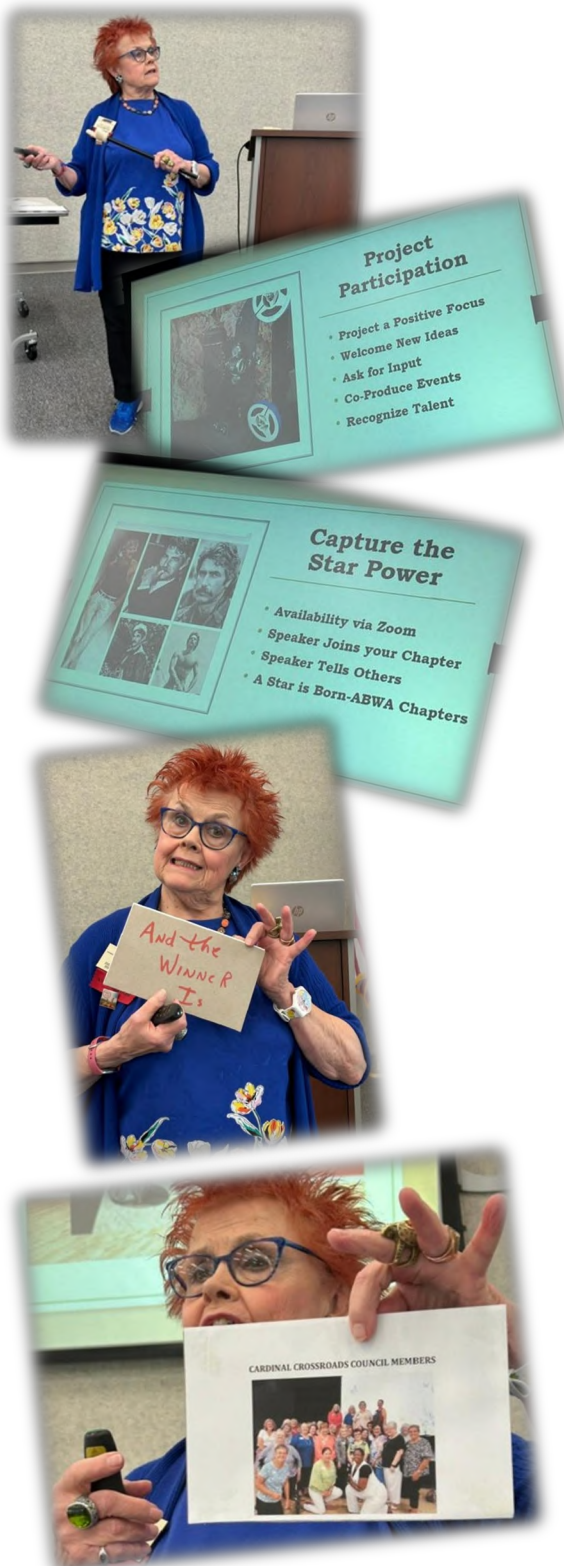

The meeting was called to order at 6:15 p.m. by President Cheryl Blair. Vice President Mary Cordle led the Invocation, Pledge, ABWA mission statement and Raintree's vision statement. Member Dawn Pokorny provided the meal.

Shirley New took another count of volunteers to work at the fundraising **Indy 500 Souvenir Booth on May 24**. She is communicating with the track coordinator.

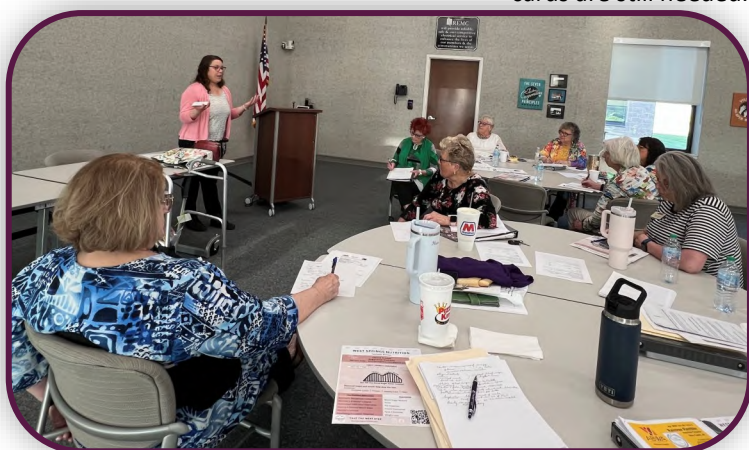

Secretary's Report

May 16, 2026

On May 16, 2026, the **60th Anniversary Celebration** of the Raintree Chapter of the American Business Women's Association was held at the New Castle/Henry County REMC. (At the regular January 2026 meeting it was agreed to suspend the regular May 21 meeting and use the May 16th anniversary meeting in its place.)

Twenty-nine women joined in celebration. Thirteen Raintree members included Cheryl Blair, Donna Collins, Mary Cordle, Janet Johnson, Karen Johnson, Leslie Mathewson, Peggy Miller, Shirley New, Dawn Pokorny, Roxie Puckett, Diane Sager, Elaine Study and Michelle Tinch. Ten ABWA guests included Cyd Berry-Rice, Renee Clement, Cheryl Cramer, Debbie deKater, JoAnn Huebner, Susie Mariutto, Mary Mills, Anne O'Neill, Cheryl Schmandt, and Tracy Sweet.

When guests arrived before 10 a.m., they were greeted at the registration table by Roxie Puckett, Janet Johnson and Karen Johnson then given a specially designed name tag, door prize ticket and asked to sign the 60th Anniversary Guest Book. Sixties music was heard in the background and a slideshow of Raintree pictures gathered throughout the years by Shirley New was playing. Table decorations were diamond themed with sparkly gold and purple balls in clear vases topped with national historic pictures provided by Cheryl Blair. "I Love ABWA" magnets were table favors. Guests were encouraged to help themselves to appetizers and the special "Diamond Sparkle" punch provided by member Dawn Pokorny, while they networked and viewed the ABWA and Raintree memorabilia organized by Donna Collins.

Elaine then began a **historical timeline** of ABWA in general and Raintree Chapter in particular. Shirley New recounted highlights of Raintree's first decade beginning on May 5, 1966, when 13 Raintree members were installed. The Rose City Chapter in Richmond, IN sponsored the Raintree Chapter. Shirley reviewed some of the chapter accomplishments of the first decade. Sharon Roberts, Shirley New and Janet Wakefield joined in 1972 and 1974 and were in attendance.

Next, President Cheryl Blair presented the special surprise of the event: the newly designed **Raintree quilt!** At every meeting since August 2025, Cheryl had included "Tips on Creating a Member Quilt" which compared creating a quilt to developing a chapter. She had several chapter members read a few of her tips. Then the big reveal: the 54" x 81" Raintree quilt complete with chap-

ter pictures and squares with current member's names, date joined and reason for joining. The colorful quilt was designed and quilted by ABWA member Eileen Caspers. The quilt was on display for the duration of the celebration.

Immediate ABWA Past National President, Anne O'Neill who had driven from her home state of Georgia, shared a few congratulatory remarks. Cheryl Blair then read **letters of congratulations** from ABWA Executive Director Elizabeth Johnson and ABWA Michigan member Diane Nixon. Raintree members read congratulation letters from the following National Board of Directors: National President Barbara Pedersen, National Secretary-Treasurer Dr. Tracey G Jackson, District II Vice President Kristina Hackett, District IV Vice President Linda B. Johnson, District V Vice President Renee Clement, and District VI Vice President Karen Fitting.

It was now time for **Member Recognition**. Event Chair Elaine Study recognized anniversary theme contest winner Leslie Mathewson and former Raintree members Melissa Jefferies, Linda Wentz and Jackie Brayton who were the contest judges. **Diamond Jubilee: Celebrating Raintree's 60 Years!** was the winning entry.
